Recovering Roles: Part 2

As we continue this series of articles on the Home and Family, we are attempting to navigate the current culture shift we find ourselves in with regards to sexuality, gender, and marriage and family. The rapid currents of this cultural shift are flowing towards a pool of generic identity that suppresses and ignores the beauty of distinction between male and female. In this pool one is merely human, and biblical manhood and womanhood are not even recognized, much less celebrated.

God made male and female, both imagebearers of the Creator (1:26), but each with a distinction in how they bear that image. The primary question we have looked at in terms of the distinction of male and female is this: What does Scripture teach about the divine design of man and woman, and are there cer-riage looks like. "For this reason a man shall tain roles that each must play in the home and family?

Biblical Womanhood for Wives

If we look back at the beginning of creation in Genesis when the first humans were formed. and as we look forward to Ephesians where we have specific teaching on marriage, we see some key characteristics that will help us understand biblical womanhood.

There is a divine design in woman to be valued as equal.

In Genesis 2, after the first man is created, he is alone (2:18). God states that it is not good for man to be alone, and yet when Adam looks over all of the other created beings, he doesn't see one that would be fit for a relationship. The language that is used is that "there was not found a helper suitable for him." There was a longing in Adam for some-

one like him. Eve was that someone. In general, woman is that for man. She is suitable; she is equal. And she is to be valued as such.

There is a divine design in woman to help. From the beginning, even before the Fall, man was created to work. God had put him in the garden to cultivate it and keep it (Gen. 2:15). When woman is created, she is created as a "helper suitable for him." This does not necessarily mean that she was to help him cultivate and keep the garden, but it does mean that she is to help in the work. But we know that based on Genesis 1:27 that Woman, as well as man, was created to labor and find joy and reward in that labor.

There is a divine design in woman to be the primary relationship for a man.

When the woman is brought to Adam, Scripture then states what the exclusivity of marleave his father and his mother, and be joined to his wife; and they shall become one flesh" (Gen. 2:24). The woman is the be the primary relationship for the man--not his father and not his mother. By this reasoning also, he should not find his primary human relationship with his son or daughter. It shall be with his wife. There is no one else that the man becomes one flesh with. In this the woman is held in great esteem--she is it for him.

There is a divine design in woman to find protection in the leadership of her husband.

In Ephesians 5, we have a clear picture of the roles of the husband and wife. He is to love and give sacrificially for her, and she is to respect and submit to her husband. In joyfully respecting her husband and submitting to his leadership, she experiences protection, not

oppression. By so doing, she invites her husband to step up and lead and she trusts God with correcting her husband rather than seeking control herself. Here she finds true freedom as she fulfills her divine design and exhibits biblical womanhood.

Based on Scripture it is clear that God has created humans as male and female. As such, they each have unique designs embedded in them that equip them to serve in equally vital but beautifully different roles. The home and family flourishes when women own their design and roles. Women, be women. Be godly women
